## Lamenting in Lent

On Ash Wednesday, we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter with a disapproving God but one who weeps day of fasting and repentance. Marking our foreheads with ash, we acknowledge that we die and return to the earth. By marking the sign of the cross, we also remember or baptism and acknowledge the new life cross—the place to which the season we are given in Christ. While we journey through Lent, we remember we are reconciled to God through Christ and humbly pray for God to make our hearts clean while we rejoice that "now is the day of salvation."

This Lenten season we will explore various kinds of lament found in scripture. Each week we will consider what it means to sit with our grief rather than try to push it aside. We will discover that many faithful believers have wrestled with grief, sorrow, and questions for God about why the innocent suffer. This series understands lament as one of the more faithful things we can do. When we approach God with honesty and humility, and we admit that some things are too big for our hearts to

bear, we will find there is not a with us. We will find a God who can take our grief and disappointment and transform them into holy joy and renewed hope. We will learn, ultimately, that Jesus' death on the of Lent leads us—is the reason we never mourn as those without hope.

Thank you to the many members that serve on our committees! Without you, we would not be able to do ministry the same way.



## **CCIC Update**

The Community Churches Interaction Council met on January 22. We are finally in good standing with the government having filed all of the appropriate non-profit status paperwork. Additionally, the churches have come together with a renewed commitment to have a positive, gospel-centered impact on our community.

The support for Feed My Starving Children and the Good Samaritan Fund continues to be strong, and there are many additional ministries we can come together to support. The Goodhue Habitat for Humanity is in need of volunteers. They are looking for local people with all sorts of skills: carpentry, plumbing, electric, and even quilting and cooking, to name a few. Ideally, Cannon Falls would have a team of capable volunteers ready to jump in whenever there are housing needs through the Habitat for Humanity program. Additionally, the Senior Center continues to grow its programming and involvement. There are many programs we can support there including fabric donations for the Dress a Girl program. Lastly, the CCIC has agreed to better support and eventually take the lead on the Thanksgiving Community Meal again (look for more information in the fall).

When we come together, just as Jesus called us, the possibilities are endless. The CCIC is currently accepting Dream Ideas as we imagine what we can achieve for the greater good of the Cannon Falls Area. I hope you will consider getting involved in at least one of these meaningful service opportunities.

Lenten Soup Suppers are back starting Wednesday, February 21! The suppers will be served at 6 pm with Lenten Worship to follow at 7 pm.

Helpers are needed to cook and serve soup for the suppers for each of the five Wednesdays during Lent. Sign up in the Narthex if you can bring soup or call the church office. To get you started, below are some "souper" recipes from FELC's *Bread for the Journey* cookbook, published in 2000.

## Lenten Soup Supper Recipes

God's Souper Squad (These recipes have been served at First English Lenten Soup Supper for many years.)

## Potato Soup

- 6 potatoes, peeled & cut 2 leeks, washed & cut
- 2 onions, chopped
- 1 carrot, pared & sliced
- 1 stalk celery, sliced
- 4 chicken bouilion cubes

1 T. parsley flakes 5 c. water 1 T. salt Pepper 1/3 c. butter 1 (13 oz.) can evaporated milk

Put all ingredients, except evaporated milk, in a crock-pot. Cover and cook on low for 10 to 12 hours. Stir in evaporated milk during the last hour. Note: If using a 2-quart crock-pot, reduce this recipe by half.

## Cheese-Vegetable Soup

- 4 chicken bouilion cubes
- 1 c. chopped onion
- 1 c. chopped celery
- 1 c. chopped carrots
- 1/2 c. diced, raw potatoes
- 1 (20 oz.) pkg. mixed, fancy frozen vegetables (broccoli, carrots, cauliflower) 2 cans cream of chicken soup
- 1 lb. Velveeta cheese

Dissolve bouillon cubes in 1 quart of water. Add onion, celery, carrots and potatoes; cook 10 to 15 minutes. Add frozen vegetables; cook 5 to 6 minutes. Add soup and cheese; heat thoroughly.

## Wild Rice Soup

- 1/3 to 1/2 c. uncooked wild rice 4 c. chicken stock/broth 1/2 c. diced celery 1/2 c. green pepper 1/4 c. onions 1/4 c. mushrooms 1 to 2 carrots
- 1/2 c. (or less) flour 1/2 tsp. sait 1/4 tsp. pepper 1/4 tsp. curry powder (opt.) 1 c. turkey, chicken or other meat Other spices Slivered almonds (opt.)

Sauté celery, green pepper, onions, mushrooms and carrots in 1/3 cup margarine or butter (with garlic), until tender. Put all in crock-pot for a day. Just before serving, add 3/4 to 1 cup half & half; stir in well. (Do not add earlier, to prevent curdling.)
