6:12. see also 4:9, 23, 32:18.

Giving received in the month of July was a little lower than the previous couple of months, but so were church expenses. We were still able to pay all expenses and end the month of July with a positive balance of \$1,083.

Boundless – God Beyond Measure

The New Testament contains several letters, known as Epistles, written by the Apostle Paul. Most of these letters were written to churches in specific communities. Through these letters Paul attempts to build and maintain relationships while encouraging people in their faith. Then, as now, there were faithful believers and staunch nonbelievers. In Ephesians 3:14-21 (CEV) we read:

¹⁴ *I kneel in prayer to the Father.* ¹⁵ *All beings in heaven and on earth receive their life from him.* ^[a] ¹⁶ *God is wonderful and glorious. I pray that his Spirit will make you become strong followers¹⁷ and that Christ will live in your hearts because of your faith. Stand firm and be deeply rooted in his love.* ¹⁸ ***I pray that you and all of God's people will understand what is called wide or long or high or deep.*** ^[b] ¹⁹ ***I want you to know all about Christ's love, although it is too wonderful to be measured. Then your lives will be filled with all that God is.*** ²⁰⁻²¹ *I pray that Christ Jesus and the church will forever bring praise to God. His power at work in us can do far more than we dare ask or imagine. Amen.*

Paul is telling us God's love is too wonderful to be measured. Another way to phrase this is God's love is boundless. The ELCA Youth Gathering is scheduled to be held July 24-28, 2022, for youth completing grades 9-12. The gathering theme is Boundless, and the key verse is 3:19 (highlighted above). This is a wonderful message for the Gathering as well as the present. As we continue to respond to the pandemic, some of our ministries are bound by

Covid-19 protocols. Your choices about how to participate in First English ministries are bound by your concerns about Covid-19. Yet, whatever binds us, God still shows up. God is with us, moving in us, and praying for us to lean into our faith.

As voted on by the church council, the Children, Youth, and Family ministry will follow the Cannon Falls School district policies for Covid-19. As I write this article, masks are optional indoors and outdoors. Some parents have shared with us their concern for their younger, unvaccinated children. Thus, we are kicking off fall with outdoor ministries and Sidewalk Sunday School for grades prek-5.

Just as Paul wrote to the people of Ephesus, I write to you encourage you to build and maintain relationships within your faith community at First English, and to encourage you in your faith. One of **the most powerful things I've learned in seminary is that God creates faith in us when we hear and read God's world. As you navigate the pandemic and** make choices for your family, please know the decisions which shape our ministries are grounded in caring for each other.

We are excited to for the Fall Kick-off on Sunday, **September 12! Wear your favorite team's jersey to** worship and stay afterwards for outdoor activities for Sunday School children, youth, and all ages! See the update for Children, Youth, and Family Ministries for specifics.


Wednesday, Sept. 15 — HS Mentor Orientation

Equip a child with the supplies they need to keep learning, even in a crisis.

Items Most Needed

(No patriotic or religious symbols), please!

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled **paper approximately 8½" X 11. (no loose-leaf paper)**

ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons

ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side & inches on the other side

ONE pencil sharpener

ONE blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band

ONE 2½ inch eraser



PERSONAL KITS

Provide much-needed self-care and critical germ fighting tools.

Items Most Needed

ONE light-weight, bath-size towel

(between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging (Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap).



COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

August 2021

The Church Council met August 12, 2021.

- The Council voted to return to Phase 3 of previously the approved COVID-19 policy. Highlights of which include:
 - ◆ Attendees wearing masks and socially distancing during worship
 - ◆ Suspending all signing by congregation during worship
 - ◆ Suspending all congregating indoors after worship
 - ◆ Aligning Sunday School and confirmation practices (masking, social distancing, etc.) with local school practices current at the time of meeting
 - ◆ Serving only commercially prepared food at activities on church property

This decision was informed by the recommendation of Becky Brown, Parish Nurse, and Dr. Megan Johnston Flanders.

- The council approved spending \$4,134.90 from the Rooted in Faith Furnishings Fund to purchase new outdoor sound system equipment from Sim Sound & Video. This will replace current equipment that is significantly aged and no longer reliable.
- Pastor Phil and Phil Jacobson reflected with gratitude on the recent Boundary Waters youth canoe trip. The trip was a blessing for all involved **to experience God's creation, learn from one another, work together as a team, and have lots of fun.**

- **Treasurer's Report: July offerings totaled** \$25,957.49 and of that total the General Fund received \$20,411.83.

6/30 Gen Fund Balance	\$ 3,134.15
July Gen Fund Income	+ 20,411.83
July Gen Fund Expenses	- 22,462.73
7/31 GENERAL FUND BAL	\$ 1,083.25

Our general fund income during the month of July was a little lower than the last couple months, but we still were able to pay all expenses and end the month with a positive balance of \$1,083.25 in the checking account. This trend of lower income in the summer months is normal and we usually need approximately \$24,500 each month in general fund income to pay all the expenses. We did use a small amount of the CARES Grant money to pay for the Tech people who ran the service taping this month, but we may need to use this fund if we have trouble keeping in the black during the next few months. The building expense pledges and rooted in faith pledges are ahead of budget at this time, and benevolence is just a little under budget. The Youth account is still in good shape with funds available for the youth events this summer.




1. Install the Give+ app on your mobile device. Can be downloaded from Google Play...Give Plus app...
2. Once you've downloaded, the app will walk you through setting up a user profile....follow the instructions.
3. Once you have the Give Plus app installed just google 'give plus' and it will show up as this on the left and you only have to click open to use.
4. The app will take you to your sign-in page. Choose "Create Account" if you haven't already done so. You will be asked to add a church—scroll down the list until you see ours—First English Church 511 Belle St. W., Cannon Falls, MN;
5. To "Sign In" after you have created an account, you will be able to enter your e-mail & password then click 'Sign In' or 'Give Now' button. This will take you to the 'Fund Details' page.
6. Click 'add' will take you to the payment page. Enter the account information you wish to have your gift taken from. Then click the 'Add+' button.
